Cindy Maack was questioning when the WIFA funding started in behalf of Fred Krafcheck. We got it in Feb. 2018. He thought there were cheaper funds available. Sharon will correspond with him via phone. Cindy also asked PSWID to remove the boulders on Pine Creek Road by the school so that vehicles could access it from Hardscrabble northbound to Randall Place when either Hardscrabble or 87 was closed. Cato Esquivel responded that the county did not want to maintain that access as a road and since 3 PSWID water lines, APS power lines and Centurylink cable all run through there; that had established a prescriptive easement for it. It is also a school safety issue if there is more traffic on that road. She will look into getting a petition to open the road.

MGC Contractors in the amount not to exceed \$500,000.00, to rehabilitate Portals 2 and Portals 3 100,000 gallon water storage tanks and associated equipment. Larry Bagshaw seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

Alan Kleinman asked Cato Esquivel about the email he had received regarding clean fill. The contractor working on the Rim Vista waterline replacement was finding that the material being excavated was unusable for backfill and was asking for authority to purchase additional backfill material. Currently they are sieving the excavated material and most is too large to use and it is time consuming. There should be adequate funds already approved for the project and if there is not, it will only be in the \$6,000 to \$7,000 range which is within the District Manager's approval authority.

RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize the Board Chairman or designee to issue a Task Order under the job order contract (JOC), to MGC Contractors in the amount not to exceed \$500,000.00, to rehabilitate Portals 2 and Portals 3 100,000-gallon water storage tanks and associated equipment.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Board approved and awarded a JOC contract to MGC Contractors in August 2018.

One of the critical factors with this project is timing. We are attempting to complete this work prior to Memorial Day weekend.

- The project will include the installation of temporary pumps and tanks. The temporary tanks will be used to allow the existing tanks to be taken out of service. Temporary scaffolding will be used to perform full coatings and structural inspection of the existing tanks. An allowance of \$10,000 per site, \$20,000 total, has been included in the project costs for additional structural repairs that may be required. The project will also include new interior and exterior coating, overflow piping, ladder and access manway
- Two 10,000-gallon temporary potable water storage tanks will be required and placed adjacent to both Portals 2 and 3 sites when the tanks rehabilitation work is in progress.
- The project will also include the cleanup and regrading of the Portal 3 site entry slope for better site access. A temporary barrier will be installed at the bottom of the site entry slope to prevent large rocks from damaging structures adjacent to Portal 3 Tank site. This work will be performed prior to reservoir tank rehabilitation work to allow safe site access during construction.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Funds are available in the in the FY 2018-19 District's WIFA capital budget. A further breakdown of the proposal and quotations is attached.
